ARRANGEMENT SCHEDULE

*“Lazy Days of Summer  
A Time of Celebrations!”*

**Class A-1: “Bicycle Built for Two”**

A parallel design. Other foliage and flowers allowed; glads predominate.

**Class A-2: “Cooling Beverages – Lemonade, Anyone?”**

A design using at least one shade of yellow glads. Container should be a beverage glass, bottle, or pitcher. Other flowers and foliage allowed; glads predominate.

**Class A-3: “Hot Days and Cool Nights”**

A design in an oriental manner using two different colored glads, one light color and one dark color. Other flowers and foliage allowed; glads predominate.

**Class A-4: “Family Reunion”**

Family gathering photo used as background. Miniature glads or glad tips only. Other foliage allowed.

**Class A-5: “Ice Cream Parlor”**

Incorporate ice cream accessories. Other flowers and foliage allowed; glads predominate.

**Class A-6: “Celebration Time”**

Designers’ choice. Use an index card to indicate the celebration. Other flowers and foliage allowed; glads predominate.

**BASKET DESIGN: Celebrating 70 Years of the Maine Gladiolus Society**

**Class A-7: “Party Time”**

At least a dozen glads of mixed colors. Other foliage and accessories allowed.

**Class A-8: “Reflecting Back 70 Years”**

At least a dozen glads of a single color or shades of one color. Other foliage allowed.

*Design Section Rules*

- 1.** The design section is open to all except professional florists.
- 2.** Gladiolus *must predominate* in all designs. Other foliage may be used if specified. *No artificial plant material* may be used. Accessories may be used as designated. Flowers need not be grown by the exhibitor but should be named when possible.
- 3.** No arrangement may exceed 26" in height or width. Arrangements are to be shown on white paper covered tables with a black background, to be provided by the flower show committee.
- 4.** The Maine Guide to Conservation shall be followed.
- 5.** There may be only one entry per class per exhibitor, but exhibitors may enter as many classes as they desire.
- 6.** A novice shall be considered an exhibitor who has never received a blue ribbon in the design section of a gladiolus show, or one who is entering the show for the first time.
